



The library has been awarded the PNG grant from the State Library for the past three years. With those funds the library was able to purchase technology and provide programming to mentor students and help them apply technology concepts in real life situations.

Kids ages 10 to 18 are welcome to use the equipment to work on person al projects during our open lab hours. Monday through Friday from 4 to 7:00 p.m. a PNG mentor will be available to guide and answer questions. Participants can access 3D printers, film production equipment and software, a laser cutter/engraver, digital design software, among other things!
