
Welcome, Jaden to the MCL Team!

We're thrilled that Jaden is a part of the MCL team!





In November, MCL's Project Next Generation events will give students age 10 - 18 the opportunity to work with 3D Printing, Filming, and Digital Film Editing - all as part of our PNG Stop-Motion Animation programs. Mandee Villa, MCL's Coordinator of Young Adult Services, will guide students through planning, filming, and producing their own movies using stop-motion techniques.

Henry Treadway, our PNG Technology Mentor, will be on hand as well, to help with the Stop-Motion programs and to lead a series of events centered around engineering. On Saturdays in November, students can learn about - and build - bridges, arches, and more.
